She completed Pediatric Residency Training at Duke University Medical Center. She previously served as the program director for the Pediatric Residency Program at Orlando Health/Arnold Palmer Hospital for Children.

Dr. Meek has chaired the Section on Breastfeeding of the American Academy of Pediatrics since 2014. She is the Immediate Past Chair of the United States Breastfeeding Committee, is a Past President of the Academy of Breastfeeding Medicine, a founding member and Past President of the Florida Breastfeeding Coalition, and a founding board member of the Mother's Milk Bank of Florida. She previously served on the Board of the International Board of Lactation Consultant Examiners. She serves on the La Leche League International Health Advisory Council. She developed and has served as the Program Chair for the Academy of Breastfeeding Medicine Course "What Every Physician Needs to Know about Breastfeeding" since 2001. Dr. Meek is the editor-in-chief of the American Academy of Pediatrics New Mother's Guide to Breastfeeding and a contributor to the AAP/ACOG Breastfeeding Handbook for Physicians. She has given many presentations on breastfeeding and infant nutrition.

Arthur Eidelman, MD, FAAP, FABM

Professor Pediatrics (Emeritus)
Hebrew University School of Medicine

Dr. Arthur I Eidelman graduated from the Einstein College of Medicine in 1963 in New York and trained in Pediatrics and Neonatology at the Yale University School of Medicine. Board certified in both Pediatrics and Perinatal and Neonatal Medicine he returned to Einstein in 1969 as the Director of Newborn Services and Assistant Director of Pediatrics.

In 1978 he moved to Israel and established the first Department of Neonatology in Israel, served as the first President of the Israel Neonatal Society and as Founding Father of the Israel Board of Neonatology. Subsequently, he became Chairman of the Department of Pediatrics at Shaare Zedek Medical Center, Jerusalem, and Professor of Pediatrics at Ben Gurion University of the Negev, the Hebrew University School of Medicine, and Research Scientist at Yale University Child Study Center. Dr Eidelman has authored over 200 peer reviewed articles, monographs, and textbooks in the field of Pediatrics and Neonatology on issues related to infection, breastfeeding, nutrition, infant neurobehavioral development and medical ethics.

Dr Eidelman has served as the International Editor of The Journal of Perinatology, (the official Journal of the Section of Perinatal Medicine of the American Academy of Pediatrics -AAP), and is currently Editor-in-Chief of Breastfeeding Medicine and the Journal of Human Lactation, and is a member of the Medical Advisory Board of La Leche League International. He is the lead author of the 2012 AAP Policy Statement: “Breast Feeding and the Use of Human Milk”.



Eyla G. Boies, MD, FABM, FAAP

UC San Diego School of Medicine

Dr Eyla Boies is a Clinical Professor of Pediatrics in the Division of Academic General Pediatrics at the University of California, San Diego. She founded and is medical director of the Premature Infant Nutrition Clinic (PINC) where over 800 infants have been seen since it's opening.

Dr Boies moved to San Diego from St Louis in 1992 where she practiced general pediatrics for nine years. She graduated from the Washington University School of Medicine in 1978 and then completed a pediatric internship, residency and fellowship in pediatric infectious diseases at St Louis Children's Hospital and Washington University School of Medicine.

Dr Boies is past president of the San Diego Breastfeeding Coalition, fellow in the Academy of Breastfeeding Medicine, fellow of the American Academy of Pediatrics and a member of the AAP Section on Breastfeeding. She was named in the list of Top Docs in San Diego from 2010-2015.
